Art. 1

(General provisions)

1. For the 2020/2021 academic year, the admission of candidates from EU and non-EU countries pursuant to art. 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n. 286, as well as non-EU countries residing abroad in the single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery, dentistry and dental prosthesis, veterinary medicine and degree courses in the health professions, referred to in Article 1, paragraph 1, letter a), of the law 2 August 1999, n. 264, takes place following the passing of a specific examination test governed by this decree.
2. In consideration of the recent measures on the containment and management of the epidemiological emergency from COVID-19, applicable on the whole national territory, mentioned in the introduction, universities must ensure, both in the access phase to the premises used for carrying out the tests both in the subsequent phases, the physical and social distancing between the candidates themselves as well as the adoption, by the candidates and all the other subjects present, of the personal and environmental hygiene measures referred to in emergency legislation mentioned in the introduction.

Art. 2

(Admission test to single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and in dentistry and dental prosthesis)

1. The admission test to single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and in dentistry and dental prosthesis, in which candidates from EU and non-EU countries as per art. 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n. 286, as well as candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad, is unique for both courses and has the same content in all the places where the test takes place as per the programs listed in Annex A to this decree. It is prepared by the Ministry of University and Research using a committee of experts with proven competence in the field, identified in compliance with the principles of impartiality, transparency and confidentiality, kept in the strictest respect for professional and professional secrecy.
2. The admission test consists in the solution of sixty questions that present five answer options, among which the candidate must identify only one, discarding the wrong conclusions, arbitrary or less probable, on topics of: general culture and logical reasoning; biology; chemistry; physics and mathematics. On the basis of the programs referred to in the aforementioned Annex A, the following are prepared: twelve (12) general knowledge questions; ten (10) of logical reasoning; eighteen (18) of biology; twelve (12) of chemistry; eight (8) of physics and mathematics.
3. The admission test begins at 12:00 and a time of 100 minutes is assigned for its performance.
4. The procedures related to the performance of the test are regulated in Annex 1, which forms an integral part of this decree.
5. Candidate students of the Sant'Anna School of Pisa who intend to take advantage of the reserve of places foreseen in the agreement stipulated with the University of Pisa must pass the admission test to the master's degree course in Medicine and surgery in one of the university locations state with a score equal to or higher than that of the last one entitled to enroll in the University of Pisa at the time of the first scrolling of the ranking.
6. For the master's degree course in medicine and surgery and dentistry and dental prosthesis, the universities in the Italian territory where the degree courses referred to in this article are active may provide test preparation courses taking into account the programs of which to attachment A of this decree.
7. The methods for carrying out the courses referred to in paragraph 6 above are defined by each university and published on the relevant dedicated website.

Art. 3

(Master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and dentistry and dental prosthesis in English)

1. The modalities, the contents of the admission test and the places available for the single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and dentistry and dental prosthesis in English are defined by specific decree of the Minister of University and Research.

Art. 7

(Admission test calendar)

1. The admission tests to the courses referred to in Articles 2, 3, 4 and 5 take place at the university premises according to the following schedule:
2. Single cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and in dentistry and dental prosthesis provided in English  Thursday 10 September 2020

Art. 8

(Rankings, minimum score threshold and assessment of tests)

1. Within the places available for enrollments, candidates from EU and non-EU countries referred to in art. Are admitted to the master's degree courses referred to in articles 2 and 4 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n. 286, as well as, within the relative reserve of places, candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad, in the descending order of the score obtained in the test referred to in the same articles 2 and 4.
2. Candidates from EU and non-EU countries referred to in art. 39, paragraph 5 of Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, no. 286 are eligible for admission to the degree courses referred to in articles 2 and 4 of this decree if they have obtained, in the respective test, a minimum score equal to twenty (20) points; unsuitable candidates are not included in the ranking.
3. To the candidates referred to in art. 5 of this decree, the minimum suitability threshold referred to in paragraph 2 above does not apply. The candidates referred to in art. 5 are

eligible only if they have scored more than zero (0) points. Candidates who have not provided any answer to any question are not included in the ranking.

4. In accordance with the European Union guidelines on the access of foreign students to university education and in accordance with the cultural foreign policy requirements of art. 46 of Presidential Decree n. 394/1999, with reference to the reserve of places for candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad, the minimum eligibility threshold referred to in paragraph 2 above does not apply. Candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad are only eligible if scored above zero (0). Candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad who have not provided any answer to any question are not included in the ranking.
5. A maximum of ninety (90) points are awarded for the assessment of the tests referred to in Articles 2, 4 and 5, taking into account the following criteria:
 - points for each correct answer
 - minus 0.4 (- 0.4) points for each wrong answer
 - 0 point for each omitted answer
6. For the courses referred to in Articles 2 and 4, the respective national single ranking relative to the candidates of the EU and non-EU countries referred to is drawn up on the basis of the score obtained by each candidate calculated according to the criteria referred to in paragraph 5 art. 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n. 286 according to the procedures referred to in Annex 2 which forms an integral part of this decree.
7. The ranking reserved for candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad is defined by universities.
8. For the courses referred to in Article 5, universities, on the basis of the score obtained in the test calculated according to the criteria referred to in paragraph 5, draw up two separate rankings, one for candidates from EU and non-EU countries of referred to in art. 39, paragraph 5, Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n. 286 and the other, reserved for candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad.
9. In case of a tie, the following criteria apply:
 - a) for the ranking of the master's degree courses in medicine and surgery and in dentistry and dental prosthesis and for the ranking of the degree courses of the health professions, the score obtained by the candidate in the solution, respectively, of the relative questions

prevails to the topics of logical reasoning and general culture, biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics;

b) for the ranking of the master's degree course in veterinary medicine, the score obtained by the candidate in the solution, respectively, of the questions relating to the topics of logical reasoning and general culture, chemistry, biology, physics and mathematics prevails, in decreasing order;

c) in case of further tie, the younger candidate prevails.

10. The condition of eligibility for admission to the degree courses referred to in articles 2 and 4 of this decree refers only to the selective procedure in place; no right derives from it in relation to access to the courses referred to in this decree in years subsequent to that in which the test was taken.

Art. 9

(Candidates with disabilities, disabilities and diagnosed with DSA)

1. The tests referred to in this decree are organized by the universities taking into account the individual needs of candidates with disabilities, disabilities pursuant to article 16 of law no. 104/1992 as well as candidates diagnosed with specific learning disorders (DSA) as per law no. 170/2010.
2. Candidates with a certificate of disability, with certification pursuant to law n. 104 of 1992 or with diagnosis of specific learning disorders (DSA) as per law no. 170 of 2010, may benefit, in the performance of the test, from special aids or compensatory measures, as well as additional times by making a specific request according to the methods set out in the university announcement.
3. The candidates referred to in paragraph 2 above may be admitted to the test with the medical certification they possess, even if not updated due to the limitation of the NHS

activity for the Covid-19 emergency, subject to , by the universities, to subsequently request the integration of the documentation provided therein.

4. The university at which the candidate will go for the test will provide for the needs related to the request made, taking all the necessary measures to meet the individual needs expressed by the candidates, also taking into account what is specified in the following points :

- a) the candidate with a certificate of disability or with certification pursuant to law n. 104 of 1992, must promptly submit to the University, for the purposes of organizing the test, the certification - in original or in a certified copy on plain paper - issued by the medical commission responsible for the territory proving the type of invalidity and / or degree of recognized handicap. The candidate has the right to an additional time not exceeding 50% more than that foreseen for the performance of the tests foreseen by the previous articles 2, 3 and 5;

- b) the candidate with DSA referred to in law no. 170 of 2010, must promptly submit to the University the diagnosis of DSA in original or in a certified copy on plain paper. In compliance with the provisions of the "guidelines on specific learning disorders" attached to the Ministerial Decree of 12 July 2011 prot. No. 5669, candidates with DSA are granted an additional time equal to a maximum of 30% more than that foreseen for the performance of the tests provided for in the previous articles 2, 3 and 5. In case of particular certified seriousness of the DSA, the Universities can allow, in order to guarantee equal opportunities in carrying out the tests themselves, the use of the following compensatory tools: non-scientific calculator; video-enlarger or coaching of a reader chosen by the University with the support of special experts or the University's Disabled and DSA Service, where established. The DSA diagnosis must have been issued to the candidate for no more than 3 years or in the period following the eighteenth year of life issued by local health facilities or by bodies and professionals accredited with the regional health service. o in any case, the following tools are allowed: dictionary and / or vocabulary; form; periodic table of the elements; conceptual map; personal computers, tablets, smartphones and other similar tools.

5. Candidates with disabilities, disabilities or with DSA from EU and non-EU countries, residing abroad who intend to take advantage of the measures referred to in the previous paragraphs, must present the certification attesting the status of disability, disability or DSA issued in country of residence, accompanied by a translation, sworn or certified by the Italian diplomatic missions in accordance with the original text, in Italian or English. The university bodies responsible for examining the certifications referred to in the preceding paragraphs ensure that the foreign documentation certifies a condition of disability, disability or specific learning disabilities recognized by Italian law.

Art. 10

(Information on the processing of personal data pursuant to articles 13 and 14 of EU Regulation 679/2016)

1. Pursuant to art. 13 and art. 14 of EU Regulation 679/2016, the information set out in Annex 3 is prepared, which forms an integral part of this decree, in which the purposes and methods of processing the personal data provided by each candidate are explained. This information is entered in the University.it portal in a visible way to each candidate who must view it when registering for the test before providing personal data, according to the procedures indicated in Annex 3 to this decree.

Art. 11

(Places available)

1. The places for enrollments in the single cycle degree and master's degree courses referred to in Articles 2, 3, 4 and 5, intended for candidates from EU and non-EU countries referred to in art. 39, paragraph 5, of Legislative Decree 25 July 1998, n.286 are distributed among the universities with subsequent decree. Candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad are allocated places according to the reserve contained in the quota referred to in the

ministerial provisions mentioned in the introduction, distributed among the universities with subsequent decree.

2. Candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad are allocated places according to the reserve determined by universities.

Art. 12

(Transparency of the stages of the procedure)

1. The university competition notices are issued with a rector's decree within 60 days before the tests are held and provide for the provisions to guarantee the transparency of all the phases of the procedure pursuant to law no. 241/1990 and subsequent amendments and additions.
2. The competition notices also define the requirements for ascertaining the identity of the candidates and their obligations during the course of the tests.
3. For the implementation of this decree, universities provide for the resources available in their budgets under current legislation without new or greater burdens on public finances.
4. For corrections of material errors and for any erroneous corrections relating to this decree and its annexes, proceeds by means of a specific notice published on the institutional website of the Ministry of University and Research.

The publication of this decree on the institutional website of the Ministry of University and Research will be given notice in the Official Journal of the Italian Republic.

Annex 1

Admission test to single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery, dentistry and dental prosthesis and veterinary medicine.

1. The Ministry of University and Research makes use of the CINECA Interuniversity Consortium, for online registration procedures for the test of this academic year. CINECA is also in charge of preparing the envelopes for each university, in a number corresponding to the estimate of the participants resulting from the enrollments, increased by at least 5%, containing the material relating to the admission tests to the single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery, in dentistry and dental prosthesis and in veterinary medicine. CINECA also prints the "instruction sheets for completing the response form" in numbers equal to the envelopes prepared for each university, as well as the publication of a movie that is uploaded on the website of the Ministry of University and Research in order to allow classroom commissions and candidates with adequate knowledge of the modalities and stages of the admission test.
2. According to the indications that will be communicated by the Ministry of University and Research, the universities shall collect the sealed boxes in which the contents are contained in the CINECA headquarters, in the presence of representatives of the Ministry of University and Research. envelopes intended for candidates participating in the tests, as well as the box (or boxes) containing the "instruction sheets for completing the answer form".
3. Each box contains:
 - a) fifty packages containing the material referred to in point 7 below;
 - b) an envelope containing fifty-five pairs of pre-cut adhesive labels, bearing a bar code with the related alphanumeric code, intended for matching the work with the candidate's personal data sheet, according to the procedure described in point h below;
4. From the delivery, each university prepares suitable measures and initiatives for the correct and diligent custody and the guarantee of the integrity of the material delivered, consisting of boxes containing the test packages, which must be intact at the time of delivery at each candidate, in order to avoid alterations, manipulations and subtractions.

5. On each exam day, before the start of the test, the president of the commission or the head of the classroom draws four students from among the candidates present in the classroom and checks with them the integrity of the boxes; therefore, opens them and distributes the packages in relation to the number of participants; give each candidate the "instruction sheet for completing the answer form". The "instruction sheets for completing the answer form" are made available to candidates before the start of the test. The Chairman of the commission or the Classroom Manager then draws up a declaration which indicates the integrity of the boxes, the number of envelopes assigned and the number of unused envelopes. This declaration is also signed by the four drawn students. On each exam day, the President of the Commission or the Classroom Manager also prepares the classroom report, prepared according to the format made available by the Ministry of University and Research.
6. In the event that one or more candidates report irregularities regarding the package received, the President of the Commission or the Classroom Manager verifies its reliability and, if necessary, replaces the package. This operation must result from the classroom minutes together with the related reasons. Replaced envelopes are not to be considered waste material but must be properly kept as required by point 9, letter e) below.
7. Each package contains:
 - a) a form for personal data that the candidate must fill out, without any identification code;
 - b) questions relating to the admission test containing the package identification code as well as n. 2 sheets dedicated to the draft;
 - c) a response form with the same identification code as the envelope;
 - d) a sheet on which the identification code of the envelope and the indication of the university and the degree course to which the test refers are affixed.

The replacement that should become necessary, during the test, of even one of the documents indicated in points b) and c) involves the complete replacement of the package, as these documents are marked by the same identification code of the package.

Any corrections or signs made by the candidate on the personal data sheet do not entail the replacement of the same. The replacement of the personal data sheet is provided only where the signs or corrections made by the candidate entail an objective identification difficulty of the candidate: in that case the commission replaces the personal data sheet by taking it from one of the reserve envelopes and the operation acknowledges in the class report. The replacement of the personal data sheet never entails in any case the replacement of the entire package.

8. The notices of competition prepared by the universities must indicate that:

from 1 July 2020 and until 15:00 (GMT + 2) on 23 July 2020, candidates register for the admission test exclusively through the procedure on the University.it portal (www.university.it). The payment of the participation fee for the test takes place according to the methods provided by the university in which the test is taken. Payment not accompanied by the online registration receipt does not entitle you to participate in the test.

a) In consideration of the legislation to contain the epidemic from Covid-19, in order to guarantee the application of the emergency provisions as well as to limit travel within the national and regional territory, each candidate, regardless of the location indicated as the first preference of assignment, take the test at the university (s) of the university / universities available in your province of residence or, if not available, in the province bordering on that of residence.

Upon enrollment, the candidate:

- 1) must select from a specific list with drop-down menu, the location in which to go for the test;

- 2) the list referred to in point 1 above, will contain the offices available within the province of residence of the candidate, in the absence of them those available within

the neighboring province with respect to that of residence of the candidate and / or in the absence also of the latter, the predetermined location in agreement with the universities;

3) the candidate is, in any case, obliged to take the test in one of the locations made available, as per the letter referred to in the introduction to this decree, dated 26 May 2020, prot. n. 001-397- JAN / 2020 with which the Conference of Italian University Rectors announces the availability of universities to use all their offices, even if the degree course in medicine and surgery is not activated, in order to avoid to a minimum the movement of candidates between regions to carry out the national programmed access tests;

4) the location referred to in point 3 above, is provided by CINECA at the time of registration;

5) the locations referred to in points 2) and 4) above are listed in Annex no. 4 which forms an integral part of this decree.

b) Enrollment in the single cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery, dentistry and dental prosthesis and veterinary medicine is arranged in relation to the placement of candidates in the merit ranking consequent to the score obtained by them and taking into account the places assigned to various universities during the planning and preferences expressed by the candidates in the registration phase.

c) Candidates, in case of use of more classrooms, are distributed by registry age, except for twins.

d) To fill in the response form, only a black pen provided by the university must be used.

e) Candidates are forbidden and it is necessary to cancel the test to interact with each other during the test, to introduce and / or use cell phones, PDAs, smartphones, smartwatches,

tablets, earphones, webcams or other similar equipment in the classrooms, as well as to introduce and / or use pens, pencils, stationery (or any other suitable writing instrument) in the candidate's personal availability and / or introduce and / or use manuals, school textbooks, as well as partial reproductions of them, handwritten notes, sheets in white and reference material.

f) The student must fill in the personal data sheet and also sign it for the purposes of the correspondence certificate of the data referred to in letter j), upon delivery of the document.

g) The candidate marks the chosen answer by placing the X mark in the corresponding box (by tracing the diagonals in the small square of the answer). The possibility of correcting the answer already given to a question is offered once and only once, taking care to completely black out the box previously marked with the X sign by choosing another one: in any case, a mark with the X sign must be in one of the five boxes so that the relative score can be attributed.

h) The answer form provides, in correspondence with the progressive number of each question, a small circular figure that the student, to give certainty of the will not to answer, must cross. This indication, once affixed, can no longer be changed. If the candidate does not put any sign in the answer boxes, even if he does not cross the circular figure, the answer is considered however not given.

i) At the end of the test, each candidate will be invited to reach a dedicated position equipped with a special pen, placed at a reasonable distance from the commission, where he will find:

- a box for the delivery of the personal data sheet, where the facsimile of the personal data sheet appears on one side;
- the pairs of adhesive labels on which the bar codes are shown.

j) Each candidate must choose a pair of identical adhesive labels present there and affix one of the two labels on the personal data sheet and the other on the answer form. The affixing of the labels must be the exclusive care of the candidate who must ensure that the alphanumeric codes on the labels of the chosen couple correspond. The candidate must therefore sign, at the bottom of the personal data sheet, the declaration of veracity of the personal data and of the correspondence of the label codes applied to the personal data sheet and the response form. At the end of these operations, the candidate must insert the personal data sheet in the closed container in the dedicated workstation and, subsequently, go to another dedicated workstation where he / she inserts the answer form in a special closed container and prepared for this purpose, taking care to insert the inside the aforementioned container, the front of the module, containing the answers provided by the candidate, face down, facing downwards.

The notices for admission to the courses referred to in art. 2 and 4 of this decree prepared by the universities must also specify that they are the cause for the cancellation of the test:

1) the performance of the test in an exam room different from the one in whose classroom lists the candidate is enrolled, unless the variation has been authorized by the exam commission and a record is given;

2) the introduction as well as the use in the classroom by the candidate of mobile phones, PDAs, smartphones, smartwatches, tablets, earphones, webcams or other similar instruments, manuals, school texts and / or even partial reproductions of them, handwritten notes and reference material;

3) the affixing on the response form (both on the front and on the back) of the signature or marks of the candidate or of a member of the commission;

4) the interaction between the candidates and / or copying attempts and / or attempts to exchange any material, including the exchange of personal data and / or response forms, in the possession of the candidates;

5) the use by the candidate, during the insertion of the personal data sheet and the form placed inside the containers used therein, of pens, pencils or any other instrument suitable for writing in order to make changes, additions and \ or corrections to the answer form.

9. At the end of the test, the president of the commission or the head of the classroom will:

a) close in the presence of the same candidates called to verify the integrity of the boxes or, in the event of their impossibility, in the presence of four other candidates drawn by lot, the special containers provided by CINECA containing the answer forms, after having counted them , keeping the front of the modules with the answers given facing downwards so as not to display anything;

b) close in the presence of the same candidates called to verify the integrity of the boxes or in any case of four other candidates drawn by lot, the special containers provided by CINECA or the containers prepared by the universities containing the personal data sheets;

c) put a signature on the labels used to close the containers;

d) invite the four students to put their signature on the same label already signed by the President of the commission;

e) packaging other containers in which the returned parcels that have been replaced, the parcels from which the personal data sheets have been taken as well as the unused parcels must be counted, enclosed and sealed, the declaration referred to in point 5 above and the copy of the classroom report (s).

At the time of the candidates' delivery of the answer forms, the President of the commission or the Classroom Manager, in the presence of each candidate, must retain, so that it is kept by the university, both for the purpose of formulating the final merit ranking and for any future request for access to the documents, the following material:

- 1) the sheets in which the test questions are printed;
- 2) the registry form;
- 3) the parcel check sheet.

All the material described above is kept by the university for five years from the test.

10. On the days and times exclusively indicated in the calendar made available to all universities (including those based in the islands), each university, by an administrative manager, will deliver, at the CINECA headquarters, to the representatives of the Ministry of university and research the material referred to in point 9, letter a), as well as the envelopes that were not used during the admission test with the relative delivery report summarizing the classroom data relating to the material referred to in point 9, letter e). The facsimile of the aforementioned delivery report is made available by the Ministry of University and Research. The material referred to in point 9, letter e) is kept at each university.
11. Such material cannot for any reason be kept by CINECA and must be taken over by the university immediately at the end of the computerized response detection procedure.
12. CINECA is entrusted with the task of proceeding with the computerized detection of the answers provided by the candidates in the answer forms, with consequent automatic determination of the relative score.
13. The Ministry of University and Research, through CINECA, publishes on the website www.universitaly.it, in the area reserved for candidates and in compliance with the rules for the protection of personal data, exclusively the score in order of the label code . These data remain available in the area reserved for candidates until the conclusion of the procedures.

14. The universities send CINECA, electronically and through a reserved site, the personal data of the individual candidates associated with the relative label codes. The universities also send, in the same way, the images of the personal data sheets according to the technical specifications that will subsequently be communicated.

15. The Ministry of University and Research authorizes CINECA to electronically transmit, via the reserved site, the files relating to the scores obtained by the candidates. After associating the personal data sheets with the response forms, candidates, through the University portal, can access the area reserved for them on the same site to view, together with their scores, the images of their work and personal data. The images of the elaborate and of the personal data sheet may also be acquired by the interested candidate via download.

Access to the reserved area in the University portal takes place after computer authentication, through individual credentials, defined by each individual candidate.

16. The procedures indicated in this annex for the academic year 2020/2021 apply to all universities present on the national territory and involved in the conduct of admission tests, regardless of the activation at each location of the single-cycle master's degree courses in medicine and surgery, in dentistry and dental prosthesis and in veterinary medicine.

Annex 2

Registration procedures, access to results and scrolling of the ranking


1. Each candidate must submit the request to participate in the admission test to the master's degree courses, referred to in articles 2 and 4 of this decree, exclusively online through the University portal (www.universitaly.it). Online registration is active from 1 July 2020 and closes without fail at 15:00 (GMT + 2) on 23 July 2020.
2. For the single cycle master's degree course in medicine and surgery and in dentistry and dental prosthesis, upon enrollment, the candidate may perform an optional psycho-aptitude test, as well as perform the simulation proposed, according to the following sections:
 - a) the first section contains seventy-two questions that explore the candidate's personality profile, academic orientation and professional orientation;
 - b) the second section provides for the administration of sixty multiple choice questions extrapolated from the tests carried out in previous years according to the breakdown by subject defined by this decree for the respective degree course.

At the end of the administration of the sixty questions referred to in point b) above, the candidate can acquire the score obtained and check the correct and / or incorrect answers given.

The registration is completed following the payment of the contribution for the participation in the test according to the procedures indicated by the university in which the candidate takes the test. In any case, these procedures must be completed by 29 July 2020.

For the purpose of defining those entitled to take part in the tests, universities send the list of students who have completed the registration to the test by paying the relative contribution by 14 August 2020 at the latest on CINECA.

3. When registering online for the test, the candidate, after registering on the University.it portal, having read the information on the purposes and methods of processing personal data, through the appropriate IT procedure provides the following information (all data marked with an asterisk are required):

The information referred to in note (a) must be entered only in the absence of an e-mail address exclusively for the purpose of providing communications regarding the selection procedures.

This information is used exclusively for all activities related to the selection for access to the master's degree programs for which the candidate has submitted the application and subsequent enrollment. All information remains stored for five years from the time of online registration of the candidate, except as provided in Annex 3 to the point "Period of retention of personal data and use also for historical and statistical purposes".

At the end of this period, these data are made anonymous.

All communications relating to the test will be sent to the e-mail address indicated when registering for the test. The candidate is responsible for verifying and promptly updating any changes in the e-mail address.

4. When registering for the test, the candidate must simultaneously indicate, in order of preference, the locations for which he intends to compete. These preferences are irrevocable and cannot be integrated after 15:00 (GMT + 2) 23 July 2020. The last "confirmation" expressed by the candidate within this deadline will in any case prevail.

The first useful preference means, in the order of the preferences indicated, the best option relating to the venue and course in which the candidate, based on the score obtained and the number of places available, can be registered.

The candidate is in any case obliged to take the test at the location indicated by CINECA at the time of enrollment, as provided in Annex 1, point 8, letter a) .

Candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad take the admission test at the location indicated as the first preference.

5. On the days indicated below, on behalf of the Ministry of University and Research, CINECA publishes only the score obtained by the candidates according to the label code on the website www.universitaly.it, in the area reserved for candidates and in compliance with the rules for the protection of personal data.
6. From the day following the date of publication of the test results and within 5 working days, those responsible for the university procedure send the data to CINECA, through a reserved website created for them by the same Consortium as the only means of communication. identification of each student taken from the personal data sheet and the scanning of the individual data sheets in pdf format. Verbal analytical drafting of the aforementioned operations that universities must make available to the Ministry of University and Research on the reserved website.

7. On 25 September 2020, on their private page of the University portal, candidates can view their work, their score and their personal details.
8. On 29 September 2020, the national ranking of merit by name is published in the area reserved for students of the University portal.
9. At each scrolling of the ranking list the candidate who:
 - a) falls within the places available relating to the first useful preference, is ASSIGNED and is required to enroll at the office and the course to which it is assigned within the deadlines set in point 10. In the event of non-compliance with the deadlines, the candidate forfeits the right to registration and the justification for the delay is of no relevance;
 - b) it is not included in the available places relating to the first useful preference, it is BOOKED on a subsequent choice. In this case, the candidate can enroll in the office and in the course within the terms established in point 11 or wait until, at the end of the registrations of those who precede him in the ranking, in the following scroll, any places on the best preferences indicated are eventually available. If the candidate enrolls in the place where he is booked, all the other preferences expressed are automatically canceled.
10. On 29 September 2020, in relation to the merit ranking and the number of places available at the universities, in the area reserved for students, the names of those ASSIGNED or BOOKED to the course and to the location indicated as before are published useful preference and a list of such candidates is provided to each university.
11. The functioning and scrolling of the rankings of each of the degree courses, referred to in this decree, for enrollment purposes takes place according to the following phases and rules:
 - a) on September 29, 2020, the nominative rankings of each degree course are published on the reserved site with the indication for each candidate of the score obtained, the position in the

ranking and the university where it is placed as "assigned" or , taking into account the position in the ranking of all the candidates who precede it and the relative seat preferences, as "booked" or as "waiting";

b) ASSIGNED candidates must register at universities according to the administrative procedures specific to each university location. BOOKED candidates can enroll at universities according to the administrative procedures of each university. In order to allow adequate management of the national ranking, it is, in any case, established both for the ASSIGNED candidates and for the BOOKED candidates who exercise this possibility, with reference to the specific scrolling, in a maximum term of 4 days for the enrollment, including the day of scrolling of the ranking and excluding Saturdays and holidays. Failure to enroll ASSIGNED candidates entails waiving the same if not exercised within the aforementioned term of 4 days. RESERVED candidates who do not exercise this possibility do not forfeit it;

c) within five days of the deadline referred to in lett. a) and, in any case, by 12:00 on the fifth day following each scroll, including the day of publication of the scroll and excluding Saturdays and holidays, each university, through its own reserved site, communicates the names of the students to CINECA registered;

d) within five days of the deadline referred to in lett. a) and, in any case, by 12:00 on the fifth day following each scroll, including the day of publication of the scroll and excluding Saturdays and holidays, all candidates, with the exception of registered students, those who have renounced the enrollment offered and candidates who fall into the status called "sold out places", must express their confirmation of interest in remaining in the ranking in the reserved area of the University website. In the absence of confirmation of interest, the candidate lapses from the national rankings in which he is inserted and does not retain any right to enroll. The justification for not confirming interest is of no relevance.

Of this forfeiture, after the deadline has expired, automatic notification is given in the reserved area. Against said notice, without any further communication or dispute by the Ministry of University and Research, an appeal may be lodged before the TAR of Lazio in the following sixty days or before the President of the Republic in the one hundred and twenty days following

publication in the reserved area of each candidate; in the absence of an appeal regarding the forfeiture within the terms indicated, the appeal filed against other reasons relating to the failure to enroll in one of the chosen degree courses, does not affect the lapse of the deadline.

e) on October 7, 2020, CINECA, having received the communications referred to in letter c), proceeds, in relation to the position of merit and the preferences expressed, to publish the new scrolling of the ranking with the procedures indicated in letters b), c) and d);

f) the subsequent scrolling of the rankings replicates the procedures and timing indicated in letters b), c) and d).

12. The universities are allowed to register candidates placed in a useful position in the ranking in years following the first only following the recognition of the related credits, as well as after ascertaining the documented availability of places at the university for the year of course in which they require enrollment, compared to the places assigned within the respective cohort of students in previous programming. These procedures, like the post-enrollment waivers, entail scrolling the ranking list for the exclusive benefit of students who are not enrolled but who are in a useful position only if communicated as long as there are still places available on the course of the individual university. Any further requests for passage or waivers subsequent to the coverage of all places in the course do not result in new scrolling of the ranking.

13. Without prejudice to the provisions of the previous point 12, enrollments for years subsequent to the first, following the credit recognition procedures by the destination university, can only take place within the limit of places made available for each year of the course, in the relevant cohort, following renunciations from studies, transfers to the same degree course or transfer to another course in foreign universities, changeover to another course in the same or different university in Italy or in any case, in the presence of facts suitable for implement the definitive vacancy of the place in the reference year, in relation to the places previously defined in the annual planning decrees, published by the Ministry of University and Research.

The universities periodically make said availability known through the publication of specific notices or notices.

Candidates who intend to be admitted to years subsequent to the first are required to submit an application only at the time of publication of these notices or notices. To this end, the successful completion of any preliminary admission test is not required. This provision applies to all national single-cycle degree and master's degree programs with programmed access to which applicants have applied for enrollment in subsequent years following the relative notices published by the universities.

The universities are not required to examine the applications received in the absence of notices or notices, in ways other than those provided for by the aforementioned deeds or outside the peremptory deadlines set by the same.

It is not allowed to enroll applicants from other degree courses with years of qualification as a repeating candidate, as well as those who have regularly enrolled in the relevant year of the course following passing the admission test arranged for the year academic in which they participated and on the related places available.

14. The universities must provide in their notices or notices that the enrollment for years following the first of a student coming from a university of an EU country or of a non-EU country is always subject to verification by the Italian university of destination, of the training course completed by the student requesting the transfer, with particular regard to the peculiarities of the degree course, the exams taken, the theoretical studies completed and the practical experiences acquired in the home university as well as the inevitable limit on the number of places available assigned to the university itself for each year of the course during the annual programming. To this end, for each of the courses referred to in this decree, the universities analytically specify in their notices or notices both the criteria for the recognition of the credits acquired in the foreign university and for the assessment

of equivalences and the number of places available for the passage or transfer to each year following the first.

Annex 3

Programs related to the questions of the admission tests to the master's degree courses in Medicine and Surgery, in Dentistry and Dental Prosthesis and in Veterinary Medicine.

Admission to the courses requires a general knowledge, with particular relevance to the literary, historical, philosophical, social and institutional sphere, as well as the ability to analyze written texts of various kinds and attitudes to logical-mathematical reasoning.

Moreover, the knowledge and skills required refer in any case to the preparation promoted by the school institutions that organize educational and didactic activities consistent with the national indications for high schools and the guidelines for technical and professional institutes, especially in view of the exams of State and which also refer to the scientific disciplines of Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics.

General culture and logical reasoning

Assessment of the ability to correctly use the Italian language in different contexts and purposes and to logically complete a reasoning, in a manner consistent with the premises, which are stated in symbolic or verbal form through multiple choice questions formulated also with short propositions, discarding the conclusions incorrect, arbitrary or less likely.

The questions focus on scientific or narrative non-fiction texts by classic or contemporary authors, or on topical texts that have appeared in newspapers or in general or specialist magazines; they

also concern cases or problems, even of an abstract nature, whose solution requires the adoption of different forms of logical reasoning.

Questions relating to general knowledge on topics addressed during the studies or present in contemporary public discourse complete this assessment.

For the historical context, the questions may concern, among other things, the aspects characterizing the history of the twentieth century and the current world (industrialization and post-industrial society; conquests of fundamental rights; new subjects and movements; welfare state and its crisis ; processes of globalization and conflict of the global world).

For the social and institutional sphere, in accordance with national indications and guidelines and in relation to the activities that are carried out for "Citizenship and Constitution", the questions may concern, inter alia, the Constitutional Charter, communication and mass media, the organization of economics and political life; the different forms of state and government.

For candidates from non-EU countries residing abroad:

- Questions relating to general knowledge of the supranational area, on issues addressed during the course of studies or present in contemporary public discourse, complete this assessment area.
- For the historical context, the questions may concern, among other things, the aspects characterizing the history of the twentieth century and the current world (industrialization and post-industrial society; conquests of fundamental rights; new subjects and movements; welfare state and its crisis ; processes of globalization and conflict of the global world).
- For the social and institutional sphere, the questions may concern, inter alia, communication and mass media, the organization of the economy and political life, the role of supranational institutions and agencies; the different forms of state and government.

Elements of chemical kinetics and catalysis.

Oxidation and reduction: oxidation number, concept of oxidant and reducing agent. Balancing simple reactions.

Acids and bases: the concept of acid and base. Acidity, neutrality and basicity of aqueous solutions.

The pH.

Hydrolysis. Buffer solutions.

Fundamentals of organic chemistry: bonds between carbon atoms, crude and structural formulas, isomerism concept. Aliphatic, alicyclic and aromatic hydrocarbons. Functional groups: alcohols, ethers, amines, aldehydes, ketones, carboxylic acids, esters, amides. Nomenclature elements.

Physics

The measurements: direct and indirect measurements, fundamental and derived quantities, physical dimensions of the quantities, knowledge of the decimal metric system and of the CGS, Technical (or Practical) (ST) and International (SI) units of measurement, of the units of measurement (names and relationships between fundamental and derived units), multiples and submultiples (names and values).

Kinematics: kinematic quantities, various motions with particular regard to uniform and uniformly accelerated rectilinear motion; uniform circular motion; harmonic motion (for all motions: definition and relationships between the related kinematic quantities).

Dynamics: vectors and operations on vectors. Forces, moments of forces with respect to a point. Moment of a pair of forces. Vector composition of forces. Definitions of mass and weight. Gravity acceleration. Density and specific gravity. Universal gravitation law, 1st, 2nd and 3rd principle of dynamics.

Work, kinetic energy, potential energies. Energy conservation principle. Impulse and momentum. Momentum conservation principle.

Mechanics of pressure fluids, and their units of measurement (not only in the SI system). Archimedes' principle.

Pascal's principle. Stevin's law. Archimedes' principle.

Thermology, thermodynamics: thermometry and calorimetry. Thermal capacity and specific heat. Heat propagation mode. State changes and latent heats. Read about perfect gases. First and second principles of thermodynamics.

Electrostatics and electrodynamics: Coulomb's law. Field and electric potential. Dielectric constant. Capacitors. Series and parallel capacitors. Direct current. Ohm's law. Kirchoff principles. Electrical resistance and resistivity. Electric heaters in series and in parallel. Work, Power. Joule effect. Generators. Electromagnetic induction and alternating currents. Effects of electric currents (thermal, chemical and magnetic).

Mathematics

Numerical sets and algebra: natural, integer, rational, real numbers. Sorting and comparison; order of magnitude and scientific notation. Operations and their properties. Proportions and percentages.

Powers with integer exponent, rational) and their properties. Radicals and their properties. Logarithms (base 10 and base e) and their properties.

Elements of combinatorial calculus. Algebraic expressions, polynomials. Notable products, nth power of a binomial, factorization of polynomials. Algebraic fractions. First and second degree algebraic equations and inequalities. Systems of equations.

Functions: fundamental notions about functions and their graphic representations (domain, codomain, study of the sign, continuity, maxima and minima, growth and decrease, etc.).

Elementary functions: integer and fractional algebraic, exponential, logarithmic, protractor. Compound functions and inverse functions.

Protractor equations and inequalities.

Geometry: polygons and their properties. Circumference and circle.

Measurements of lengths, surfaces and volumes. Isometries, similarities and equivalences in the plane. Geometric places. Measurement of angles in degrees and radians. Sine, cosine, tangent of an angle and their remarkable values. Protractor formulas. Resolution of triangles. Cartesian reference system in the plane. Distance of two points and midpoint of a segment. Straight line equation. Parallelism and perpendicularity conditions. Distance of a point from a straight line.

Circumference, parabola, hyperbola, ellipse equation and their representation in the Cartesian plane. Pythagorean theorem. Euclid's theorems (first and second). Probability and statistics: frequency distributions according to the type of character and main graphic representations. Concept of random experiment and event. Probability and frequency.
